


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## **PPTC Quarterly Update** **July 2009**

This is a 'quarterly report' from the Office of the Provincial Paediatric Therapy Consultant. The intent is that this update will increase awareness amongst stakeholders involved in paediatric therapy services in BC of the activities of this Office. This is the first quarterly report for the 2009-2010 fiscal year.

### **Main Initiatives**

#### **Promoting Manageable Workloads**

- The latest resource available as part of the Promoting Manageable Workloads initiative is the first phase of the 'eLibrary' project. This phase of the eLibrary provides agencies and therapists with different referral management strategies designed to assist agencies seeking to revamp their referral management process. There are four strategies provided, and the intent is for agencies to review the four strategies and use aspects of each to form a referral management process that meets the needs of their specific agency. - The Office of the Provincial Paediatric Therapy Consultant is also involved as an agency sponsor supporting the work of Kathy Davidson's Master's project on a points-based caseload management tool. It is hoped that further development of this tool will provide additional resources to continue to work towards manageable workloads for BC's paediatric therapists. #### **eLearning Fund**

- Funding continues to be available to support BC therapists and agencies utilizing technology to access continuing education opportunities. Funds to assist in the costs of continuing ed. via videoconferencing, telehealth/tele-CDR, etc. all qualify. - The PPTC is currently facilitating the organization of videoconferencing sessions for the North, Interior, and Vancouver Island regions. eLearning funds will be

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used to subsidize bridging costs for agencies in the respective region to access the call.

You will be responsible for reserving the equipment for that day. ### **eMentoring Project**

- The PPTC has collaborated with Sue Stewart and Sunny Hill Health Centre to develop an electronic mentoring program for BC therapists. The program operates on a cost recovery basis, so agencies will be charged a reasonable fee to provide support to a therapist at their agency via an eMentor. We are confident this program will significantly contribute to the recruitment and retention of paediatric therapists in BC. At this point, the program has a small pool of trained eMentors to select from. However, in the event we require additional eMentors we will be placing out a call via the therapybc email database. So if you are keen on becoming an eMentor keep on the lookout for this announcement later this year.

- The 2009 Paediatric Update Symposium proved to be a tremendous success. Several of the presentations have been recorded as audiocasts, and work has begun on posting the audiocasts with the corresponding power point presentations from the conference. ### **Student Initiatives**

- The UBC OT, PT, and SLP job fair is took place on Thursday May 28<sup>th</sup> at the Thea Koerner House - Graduate Student Centre on UBC Vancouver campus. It was a very well attended event by the graduating OT and PT class, and there was significant interest in paediatrics. If you are an agency posting positions on therapybc make sure you aren't dissuading this next generation of paediatric therapists with statements such as 'require 2 years paediatric experience' in your job postings. With initiatives through the PPTC such as the eMentoring program we can provide these new grads with the support they require to excel in paediatric therapy. Attendance from the SLP class was poor due to the timing (they were out on clinical placement at the time), but I did the chance to address the graduating SLP's earlier in the year.

- The UBC OT Capstone Conference takes place on Friday August 28<sup>th</sup> from 8:30am to 4:45pm. The Capstone Conference is an opportunity for the 2009 Master of Occupational Therapy graduates to present their research to their upcoming colleagues and promote discussion amongst both professionals and students.
